About Us / What We DO?

- BLBF was formed November 12, 2010 and has 501c3 status.
- Our mission is to get involved, serve families and to bring change in communities.
- We offer scholarships to high school students studying in the barbering and cosmetology professions. We also award scholarships to college-bound students.
- Previously participated in the Gun Violence Presentation at Ferris School class sponsored by Delaware Center for Justice, Inc., with Davi Mozi, Donna Pugh, Esquire, Amir Lyles and a few mothers. Every year in June, we participate in their “Resource Day” and engage students about life skills and Ms. Brinkley White shares her personal story surrounding gun violence.
- 2013 BLBF partnered with Christiana Care’s Trauma Unit to deliver “You Only Live Once,” which features Brandon’s story as the patient they loss to gun violence and explore the reality of gun violence. This violence prevention program is a trauma resuscitation which re-enacts emergency procedures using breathing tubes, artificial blood and other equipment. Christiana Care engages middle and high school students aged 13 – 18 years of age who come into the hospital from their schools. BLBF generally engage youth about our loss and more.
- March 28, 2016 – As founder of BLBF, I along with other community leaders across Delaware was invited by former Councilwoman Gabby Giffords and Delaware Coalition Against Gun Violence to participate in the launch of Americans For Responsible Solutions.
- We provide assistance by funding low-income families for summer sports activities.
- Our outreach and annual community ministry allows each associate and their families at BLBF, Inc., to serve the Sunday Breakfast Mission Thanksgiving Day and contributing to their campaigns that help restore individuals who were and/are homeless.
- August 16, 2019 BLBF served women living in Middletown (Aquila, Inc.), served a population of women with substance abuse, alcohol and mental health issues. “Make Me Pretty” was meant to uplift their spirits and be of service... We also shared booklets and other information to help the ladies with their job search, how to dress for an interview and gifted each with personal items. We were invited to model clothing for their dress for success, cook and teach them about table setting and basically to be of support.
- We are partnered with several grassroot organizations such as: Connecting Families 4 Justice, Delaware Coalition Against Gun Violence (Board member), Mom’s Demand Action, all fighting for common sense gun laws/legislation, hoping to make communities safer with protection for all along with other community endeavors.

- August 2019, Launched Talks With Tilly – Colors: Orange and Blue
Focus: Career Development, college readiness, physical health and mental health awareness.
Target: Serving ladies ages 13 – 21 (can be older).
Eligibility: A person requesting or in need of services.
Community service project: Food drives and Adopt a Family (holidays)

Goal to Create: Grief Share for Youth

Focus: Being a positive mentor and providing resources
Target: Serving young ages 13- 21; perhaps older

How we do it differently from other competition? When we were initially formed, we stated in our communications that, “The family’s prayer is that BLBF will reach a multitude of people through outreach within our communities.” We serve many communities starting with cosmetology and barbering high school students, college-bound students, adjudicated youth at Ferris School for Boys & Girls, we have sponsored “Hair Do Day” for immediate family and survivors of gun violence, donations sponsor students less fortunate during summer camp,

Who Is It For? Our programs service youth, high school and college-bound student, families and survivors of gun violence, homeless population and a population who suffers from substance abuse issues.
